WHEREAS, the need exists for each citizen to respect, recognize and appreciate Evanston's racial and cultural differences; and


WHEREAS, it is time for Evanston residents to reject racism, divisive attitudes and behaviors,


SECTION 1: That the City Council of Evanston does hereby and henceforth declare September to be Unity Month - a celebration of Evanston's racial and cultural diversity.
